A COMPETITION FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS IN CANADIAN LAW SCHOOLS

The IIC Law Student Writing Award Program engages and generates interest among undergraduate law students in the practice of corporate insolvency and restructuring through the research and development of papers.

THE INSOLVENCY INSTITUTE **OF CANADA**

The IIC is Canada's premier private sector insolvency organization. It is a non-profit organization dedicated to the promotion of excellence and thought leadership in commercial insolvency and restructuring policy and practice in Canada. Members of the IIC are drawn from the most senior and experienced members of the insolvency community. Membership is limited to 135 insolvency practitioners (trustees, lawyers and restructuring professionals) who are joined by representatives of regulatory and compensation bodies, major financial institutions and prominent members of the academic community.

IIC LAW STUDENT WRITING AWARD PROGRAM

This is the 14th year of the IIC Law Student Writing Award Program which is designed to support and reward academic scholarship in the area of corporate insolvency and restructuring. This program gives undergraduate students the opportunity to research insolvency issues and bring their proposals for reform to the attention of the business and legal community which they are about to enter.

ELIGIBILITY

- The competition is open to law students in full-time undergraduate law programs at Canadian universities. Entries may be submitted in English or French.
- · Each student is limited to one entry. There is no limit to the number of entries that may be submitted from one university, but each

paper must bear the endorsement of a law faculty member.

- Papers must be no longer than 3,000 words (exclusive of footnotes) and must be typed. Papers may be jointly written.
- Papers must be submitted electronically to the Executive Director at the email provided in the entry form by the deadline.
- · The paper must be focused on restructuring in an insolvency context.

PAST RECIPIENTS



First Place, \$7,500: Mr. Dylan Gibbs, University of Alberta "Whose Restructuring is it Anyway? The Disconnect Between Third-Party Releases and the CCAA's Restructuring Purpose."

Mr. Gibbs received his award and was recognized for his achievement at the 2017 Conference in Banff, Alberta.

Second Place, \$5,000:

Mia Tritter, Western University "Has the Door to Equitable Subordination in CCAA Proceedings Been Closed?"

Third Place, \$2,500:

Nicholas Dempsey, Western University "Is the Third Time the Charm: The Supreme Court of Canada's Opportunity to Clarify the Question of the Equitable Subordination Under the CCAA."



2018 AWARDS

First, second and third prizes of \$7,500, \$5,000 and \$2,500 will be awarded. The prize for the first-place winner will be presented at the IIC's annual conference being held September 27-30, 2018 in Charlottetown, PEI. Both the first place winner and their faculty sponsor will be invited quests of the IIC at the conference, with complimentary conference registration (including accommodations). Travel costs will be reimbursed. If a co-authored paper is selected for first place, the division of the prize and the reimbursed travel costs will be entirely at the discretion of the winners.

All papers provided to the Judges are confidential and do not include the author's name or university affiliation to ensure impartiality during the judging and winning paper selection process.
